





#### WORLD TABLE TENNIS DAY 2018 – EVENT REPORT

#### Intro message

April 6, 2018 stood in the sign of solidarity. The ITTF chose World Table Tennis Day to soft-launch its own non-profit Foundation aiming to promote "Solidarity through Table Tennis". Appropriately, this edition brought many examples of how table tennis is shared with others. All around the world, clubs opened their doors for Come and Try Days and we saw a big commitment of Non-Governmental Organisations who were involved in half of the 597 registered events; in Turkey a granite table tennis table was set up for public play, in areas of conflict, such as Kenya or Afghanistan, table tennis games were organised to promote peace, social barriers were broken down in countries like Argentina or Haiti, and children with no access to table tennis got in touch with the game for the first time in rural Tunisia. All in all, almost 100,000 people enjoyed playing table tennis on April 6 2018!

On World Table Tennis Day we share the love for our sport, but we are also sharing knowledge, healthy and peaceful behaviour, fun, materials, and many more. Throughout the 597 events in 97 countries, we also find a lot of events celebrated in public places such as shopping malls, pedestrian streets, beaches and parks. Surely, table tennis was in the public talk in many cities!

As in previous years and also thanks to the kind contribution of iPong and Butterfly, featured projects received iPong

robots and equipment. All organisers sharing a video with us received 2 T-Shirts that were especially created for World Table Tennis Day 2018 and are not purchasable.

My personal thanks go to our sponsors Butterfly and iPong, to our partners from Peace & Sport and UNHCR for the joint celebration in Za'atari, Carolina Rosso for her patience and ideas with graphic design, to Etsuko Enami for her help with the statistics, to Romina Concha Sepúlveda for her Social Media Management and to Wiebke Scheffler for all those little and unseen steps. Further I'd like to thank the ITTF officials and staff for their continuous support.

My biggest congratulations are reserved for each single organiser and participant. It's thanks to your love for our sport that we develop and make table tennis accessible to everyone everywhere!

And of course, thanks to you, reader of this report, for your interest in World Table Tennis Day and your help to spread the word and make it grow in 2019.

#### ITTF Main Celebrations

Za'atari is located in the desert. The 4th largest Jordan city is made up of shelters, administration buildings, some hospitals, schools and a market-like structure. For around 80.000 persons, more than the half under 18, their life at home is a past memory. The hopes of a fast return to their homes in Syria are undefined. They are safe from war now, but they can't leave the camp without a permission. Their future is uncertain, not all children attend school, many parents don't see the necessary believing in a soon return home, where the ongoing conflicts will have destroyed their economic and social life.

Camp life is tough, and many depends on the charity of others. The memories of traumatic experiences in the past, fear about an uncertain future and boredom are only some of the emotions that can be find among the inhabitants.

Sport is a powerful tool to help. Over 20 NGOs use sport within Za'atari, The ITTF Foundation developed together with UNHCR and Peace & Sport the 2 years project "Nittaku Dream Building with Refugees", aiming to promote positive individual and social change inside the Syrian Refugee community in Za'atari and to increase cooperation and strengthen social cohesion between Syrian refugees and Jordan people.

In 2017 first trainers were trained, and 6 table tennis trainers are now giving weekly sessions to children in the camp.




